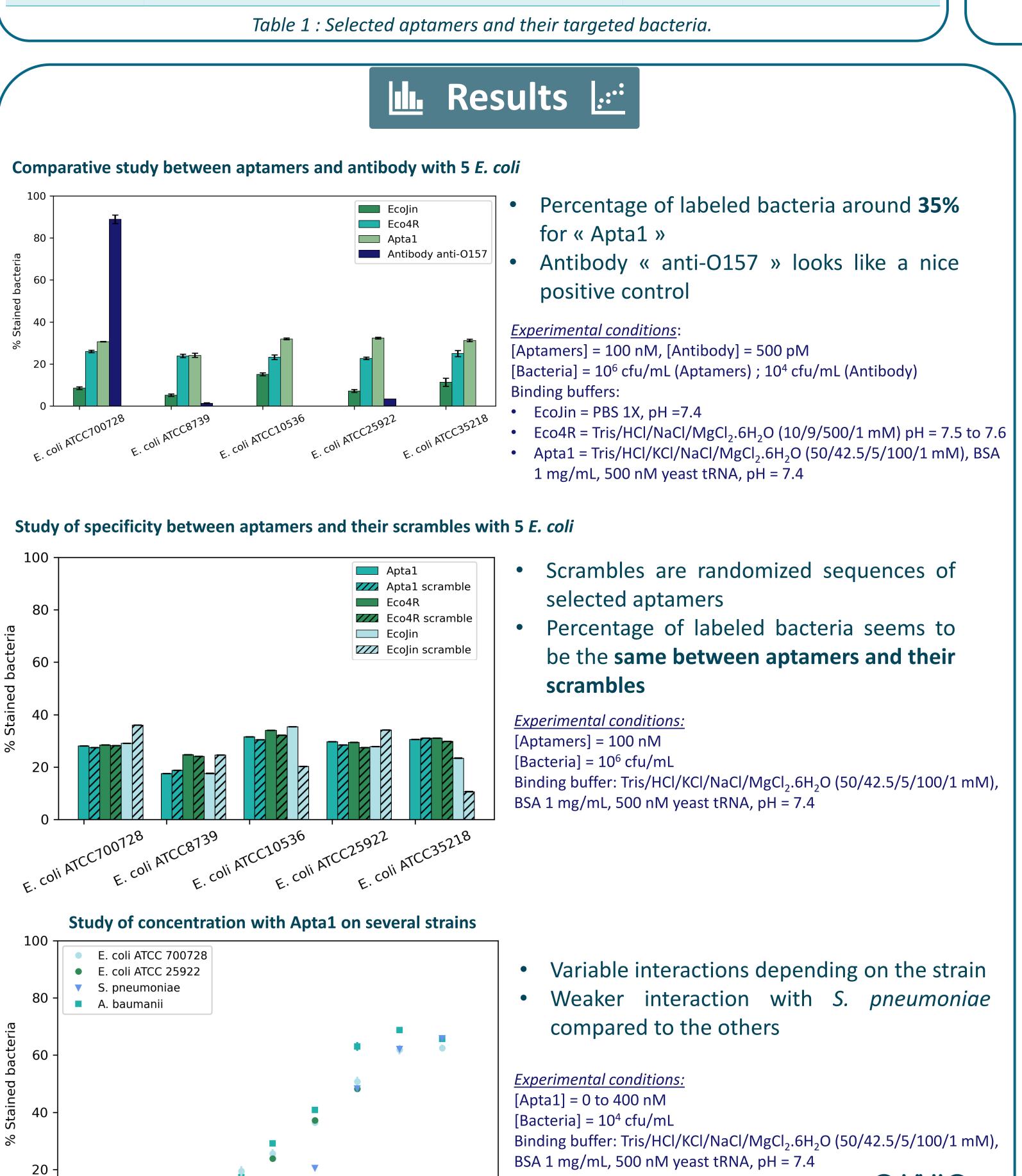
Complementary sequences

They are used to block the pores of the nanoparticle by hybridizing with the aptamers already present on its surface

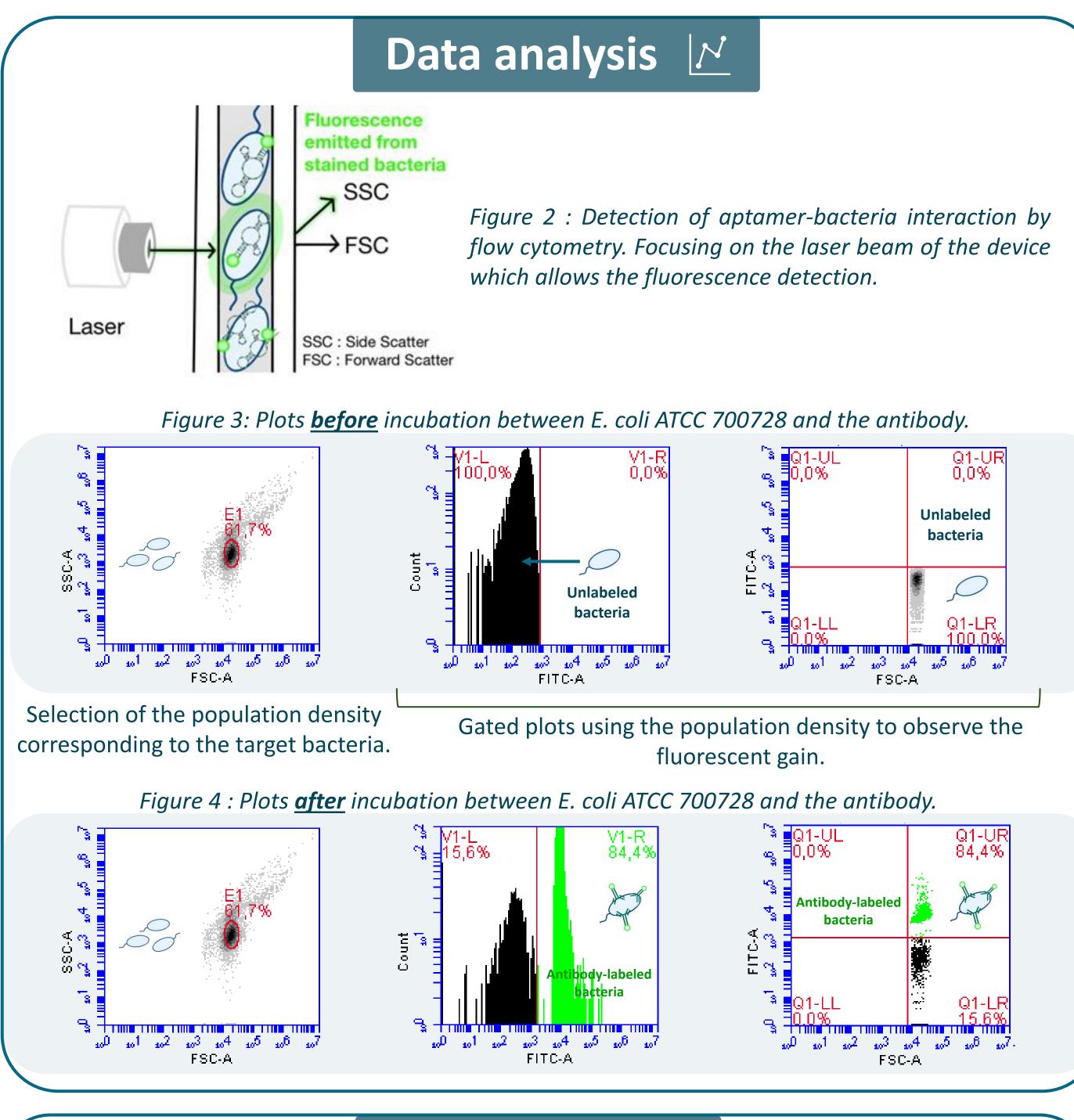

Conclusion [2]

- Flow cytometry: effective analytical technique for studying the interactions between aptamers/antibodies and bacteria
- Every aptamer demonstrates interaction with *E. coli* bacteria
- It remains challenging to establish a distinct differentiation window between *E. coli* and the other strains that were tested
- Future experiments : study specificity of alternative aptamers across different strains.
