



Statistical modelling of a semi-industrial membrane bioreactor using fuzzy inference methods

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Context and Objectives

Context: Membrane bioreactors

- Coupling biological treatment & physical separation
- + Good and constant quality of the effluent
- Membrane fouling and linked operating costs
- Interest of modelling to predict and optimise the operation of such treatment unit at large scales

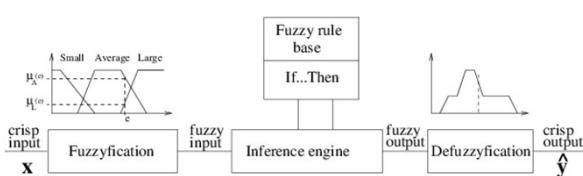


Objectives

- Develop a fuzzy logic procedure adapted for the simulation of a semi-industrial filtration pilot coupled with a full scale MBR
- Simulate the evolution of the permeability for a 4.5 months campaign on a semi-industrial filtration pilot
- Analyse coupled impact of filtration operating parameters and functioning conditions on fouling

Material and methods

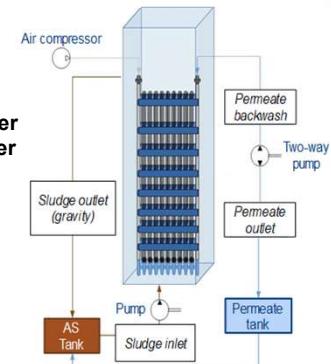
Fuzzy Inference System (FIS) design and optimisation



- Principle:** Machine Learning (ML) simulation of physical and biological systems using simple rules (If ... Then) with input variables distributed in fuzzy sets
- In the Fispro software:
 - Partition of variables in fuzzy sets using the Hierarchical Fuzzy Partitioning (HFP) and the K-means clustering algorithm

Experimental database

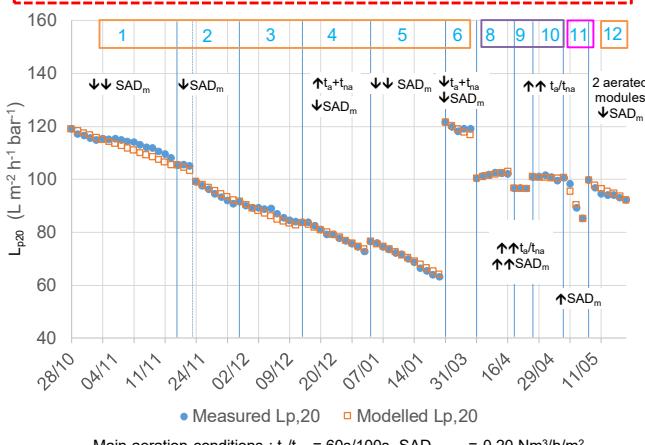
- Semi-industrial filtration pilot (2 m³, 3 modules KMS Puron®)
- Continuous feed with mixed liquor** (TDJ unit: MBR treating rejection water from digested sludge dewatering after thermic treatment (10,000 m³/d))
- 11 operating conditions**
 - Variation of operating parameters: air flowrate, number of aerated modules and sequencing of aeration
 - Two main filtration modes
 - Filtration/backwash : 480s/90s
 - Filtration/relaxation : 98s/121s, 121s/98s
- Supervising permeability (Lp) and properties of mixed liquor and of permeat



Results

Development of a predictive model

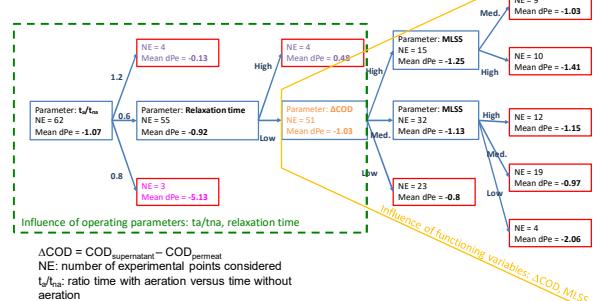
- Inferring the permeability drop $dPe = Lp_{j+1} - Lp_j$
- Lp initialised at the beginning of each new operating condition



- Interest of FIS for the prediction of the evolution of fouling

Fuzzy decision tree

- Limitation to 9 rules = 9 leaves



- Major influence of the operating parameters t_a/t_na and Relaxation time

Since operating parameters varied around a main condition, this part of the tree includes a main trunk

- Influence of operating variables $ΔCOD$ and $MLSS$

Branched tree

Very non-linear influence of $MLSS$

Conclusions and Perspectives

- Efficient modelling of all experimental trends: for the different operating conditions, with a limited number of rules
- Development of an **interpretable model**:
 - Ranking** of the impact of operating parameters and functioning variables on fouling evolution (filtration mode > mixed liquor properties > aeration parameters)
 - Non-linear evolution of fouling with MLSS → **Understanding the influence of MLSS concentration on fouling**
- Further research: Modelling the full scale plant with the same approach
