## **Pore collapse in the altered layer of a borosilicate glass**

Schematic of the altered layer and its elemental concentration profile for a CJ2type borosilicate glass, adapted from 4.

Material formed by inter-diffusion and in situ hvdrolvsis/condensation reactions



Pore shrinkage and closure was observed in the alteration gel of a **CJ2 borosilicate glass**.

- This effect could play a role in a potential **passivation** of the alteration gel.

### Monitoring the irradiation-induced pore collapse of mesoporous silica

SAXS profiles of MCM-41 pellets under a 2 MeV electron beam at various doses, reproduced from 1. The initial profile features a well-defined hexagonal structure, as pointed by the peak labels.





departure of initial water due to the instrument's vacuum, must be investigated.

Evolution of the TEM image of the **long-term altered layer** of a CJ2 glass under irradiation, reproduced from 3. Fluences of Xe, 600keV, range from 0 to 4,6.10<sup>14</sup> Xe.cm<sup>-2</sup>. Yellow arrows serve as visual aid.



The collapse of (hexagonal, P6mm) porous structure of mesoporous silica, such as SBA-15 or MCM-41 can be monitored using X-ray diffusion techniques, such as **SAXS** (Small Angle X-ray Scattering, top left), or **XRR** (X-Ray Reflectivity, bottom left) for thin films.

## Studying the structure of mesoporous materials in coupled aqueous/irradiation conditions.



- XRR measurements before and after immersion show that immersion induces interlayer ( $d_{100}$ ) and global swelling < 5%
- On the short term, the structure organization is well-preserved.









Mesoporous silica thin films samples were dip-coated and calcinated. Somes samples were immersed in water for several days prior to irradiation, then dried in open air before entering the irradiation chamber. Other samples were kept in contact with water throughout irradiation.

Samples were irradiated with Xe and Ne ion beams at various fluences. From the comparison between sample series:

- no significant difference between immersed sample series  $\rightarrow$  simpler distinction
- Immersed samples undergo smaller collapse than dry samples.
