The communication will focus on the development of unconventional forms of agricultural land management ("portage foncier") in relation to a survey carried out in a rural area close to Lyon and to the citizens engagement in the French association called Terre de Liens.

Such alternatives will be addressed in a dual context of action, pointed both at maintaining peasant agriculture in opposition to the dominant model of industrial agriculture, and at developing resource management methods and forms of social action "in common".

The French example can thus be discussed in comparison with Italian situations and practices, giving rise to a cross-examination of the notions of local development and bioregion.
