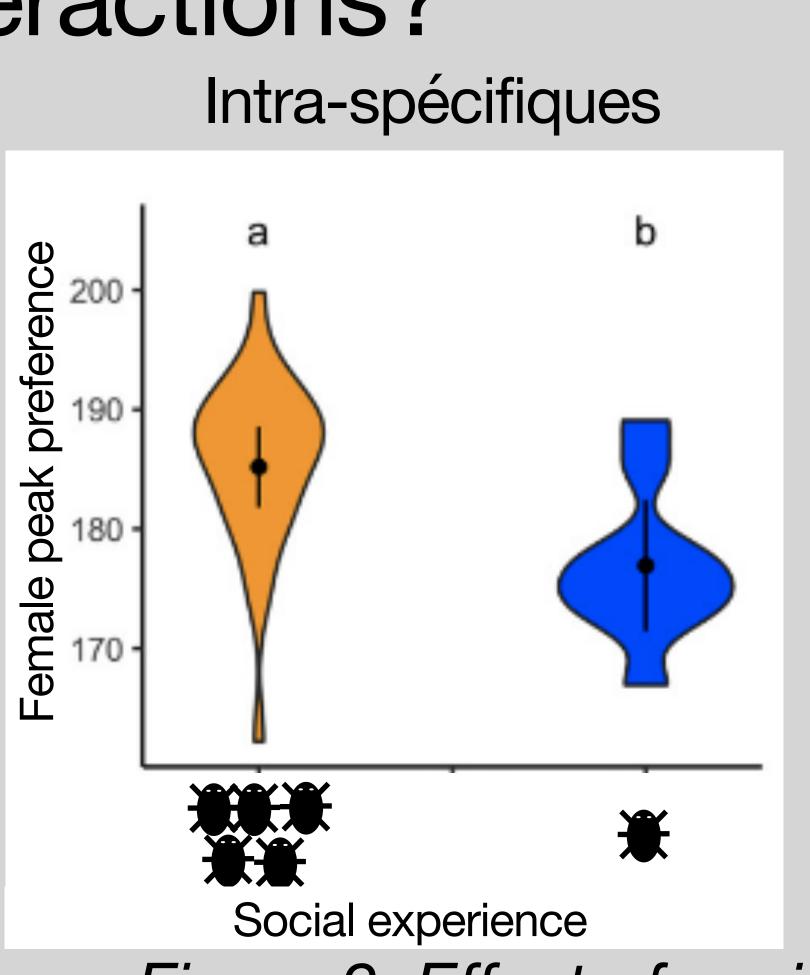

Question: What are the consequences of social interactions?



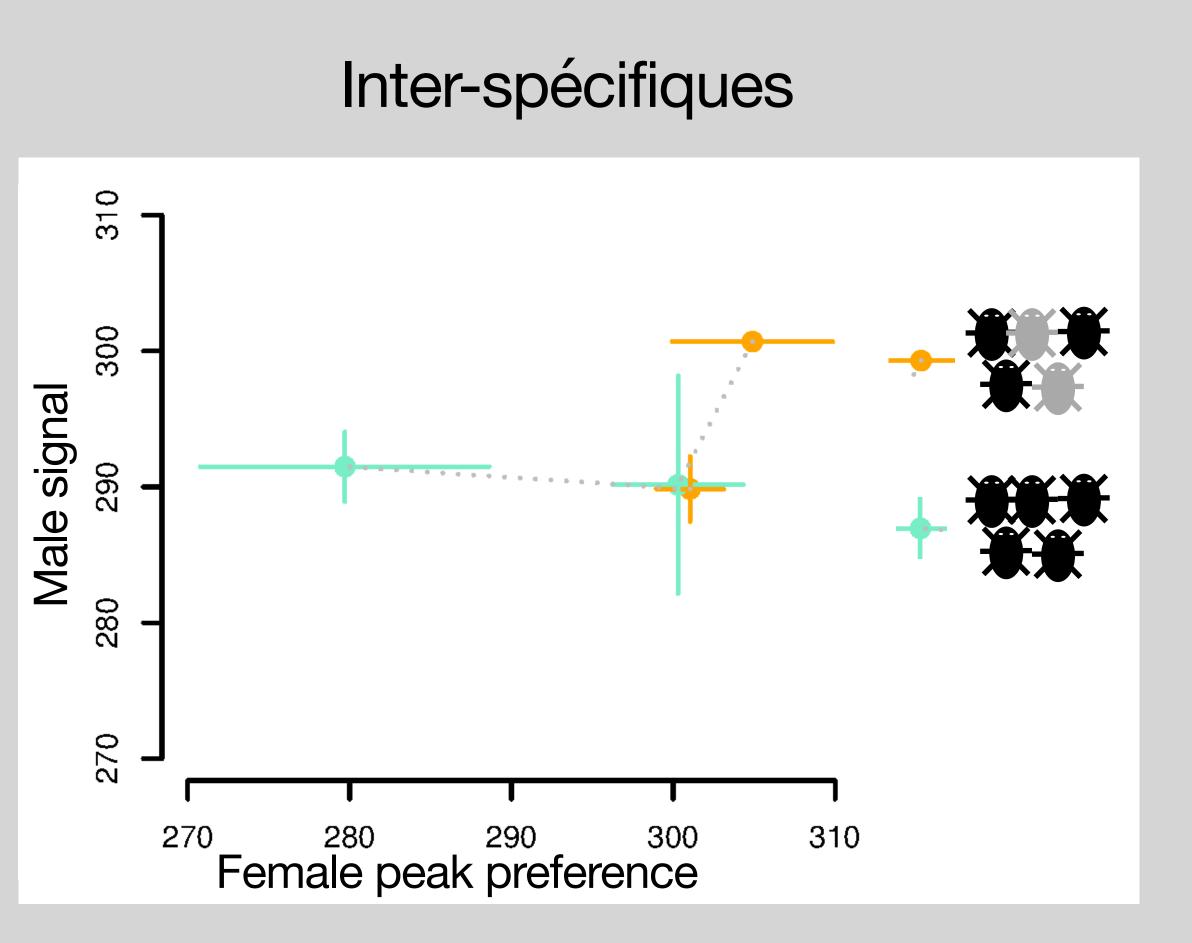


Figure 2: Effect of social interactions on signals and preferences

Results: Effects on signals and preferences

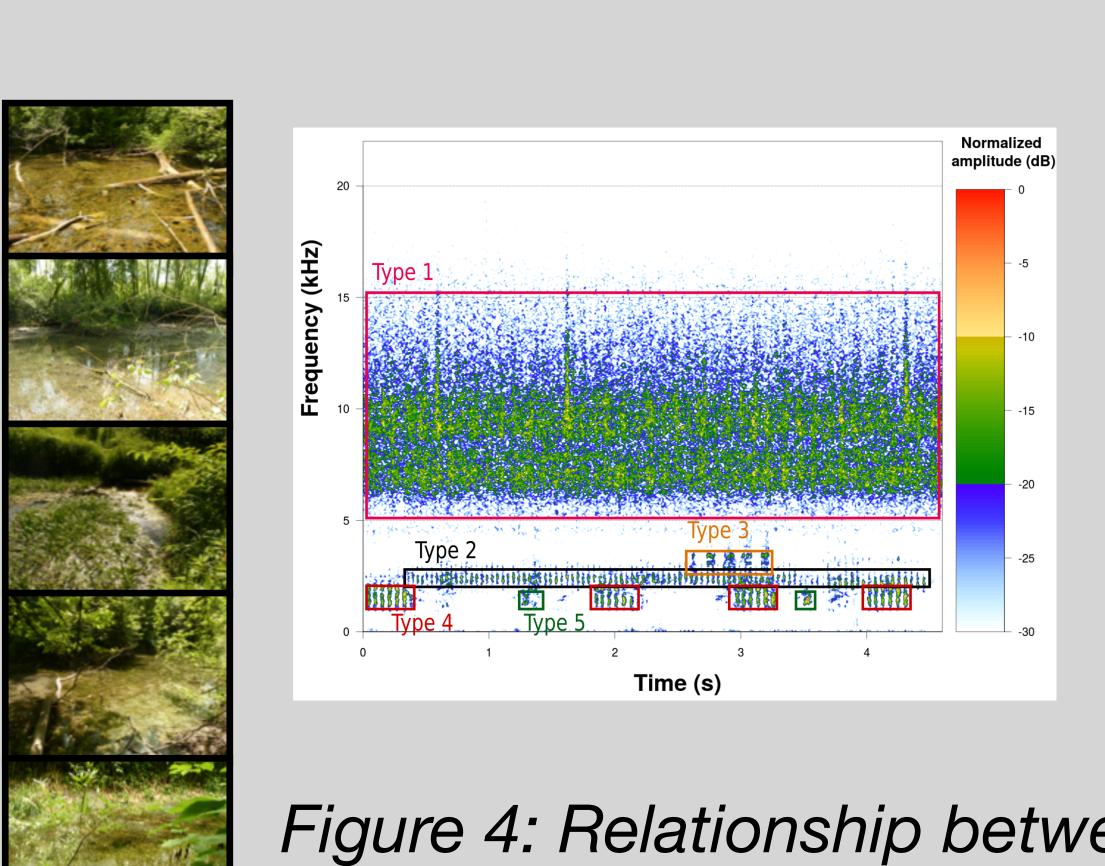
Conclusion: Social interactions can be detected

Question: Can we measure diversity with acoustics?



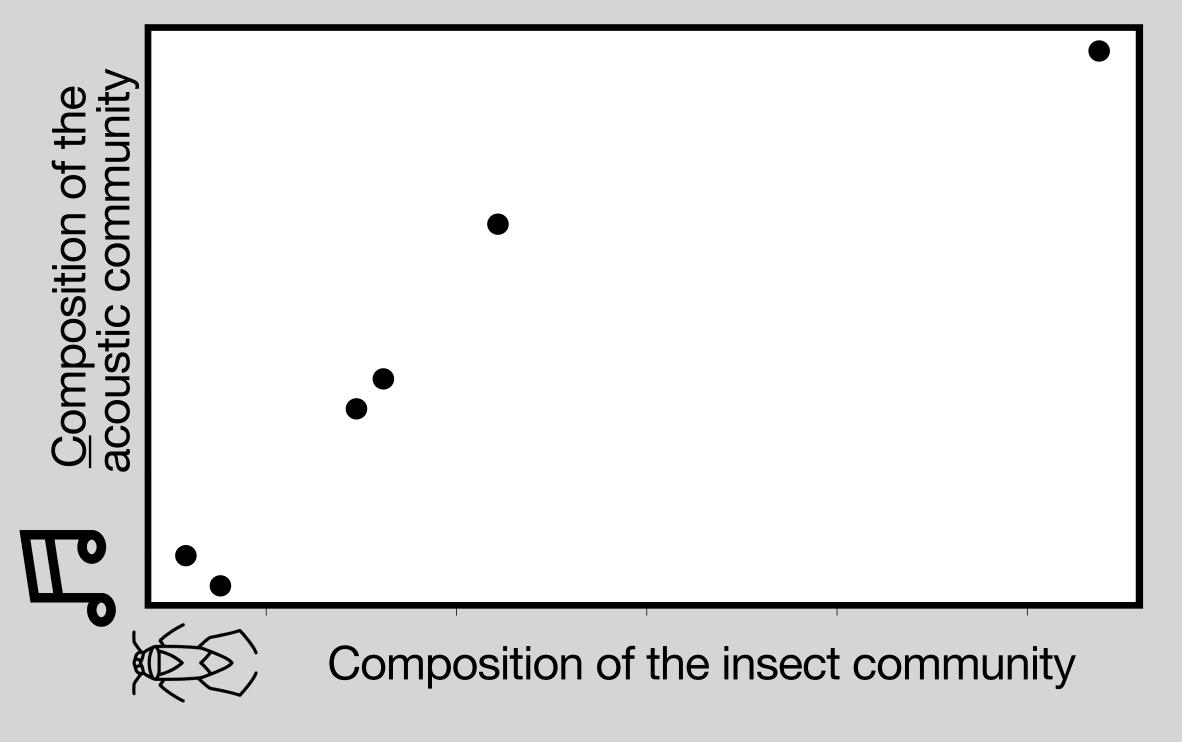


Figure 4: Relationship between acoustic and aquatic insect communities

Conclusion: Prediction of climate induced spatio-temporal shifts

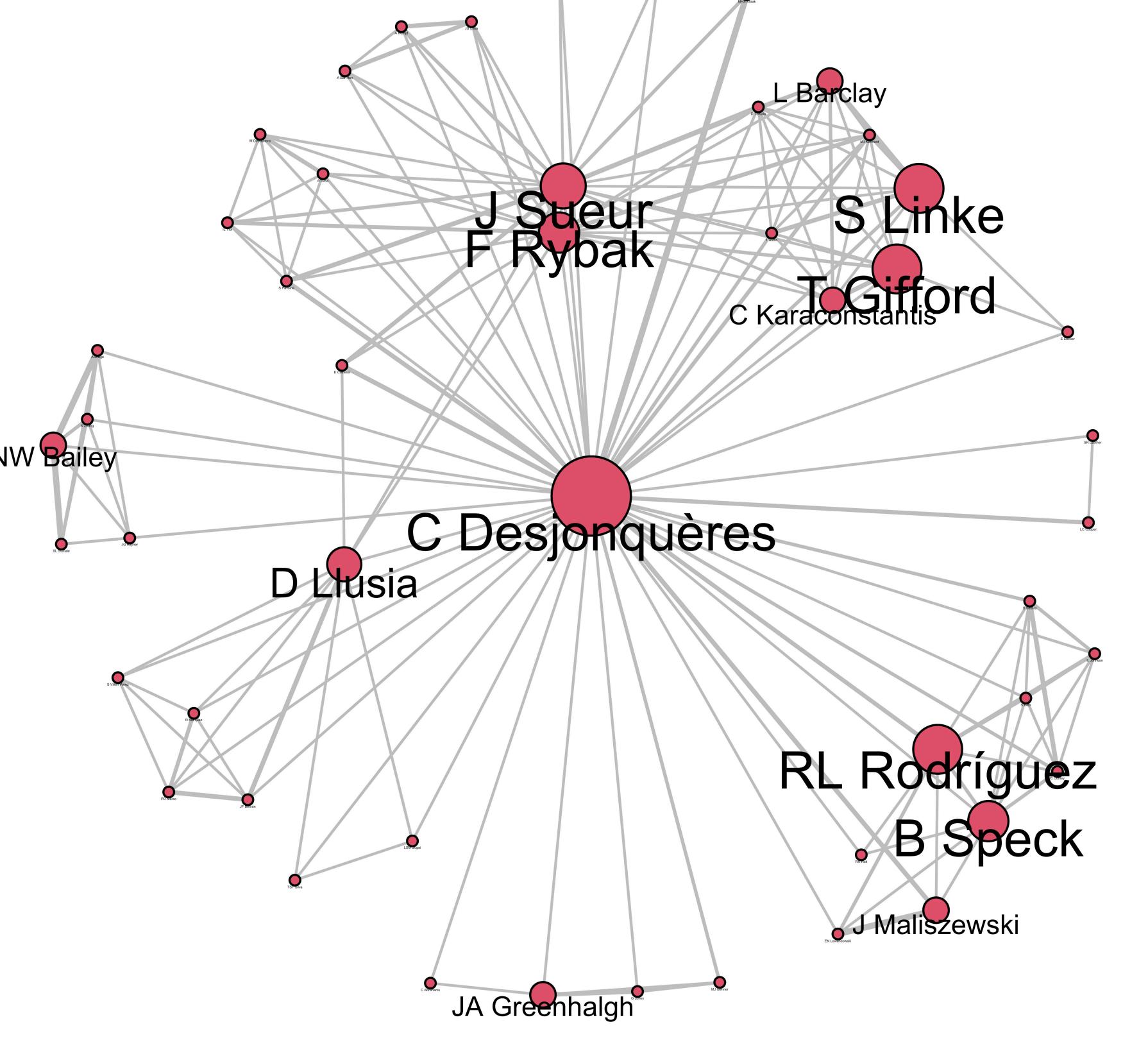
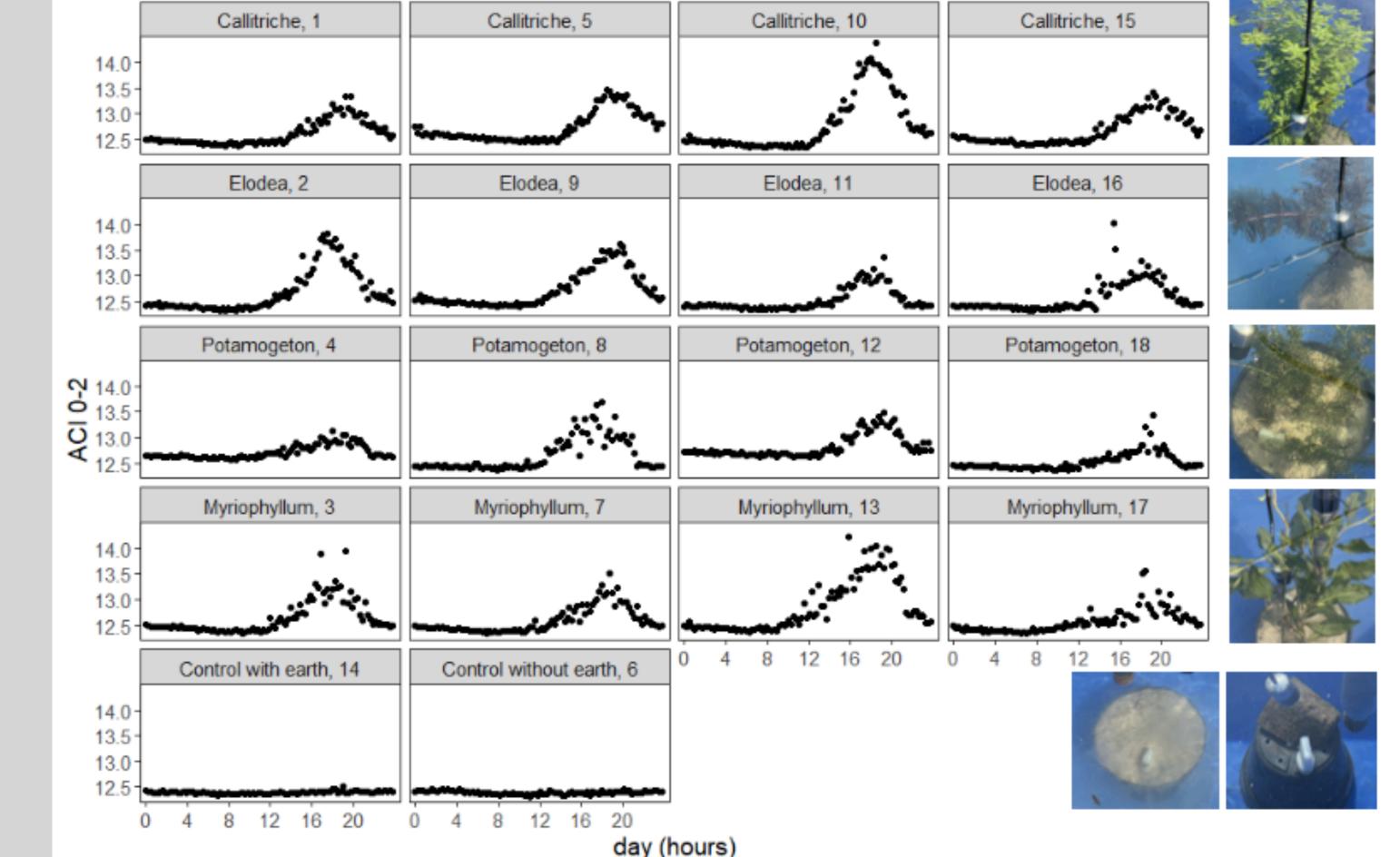
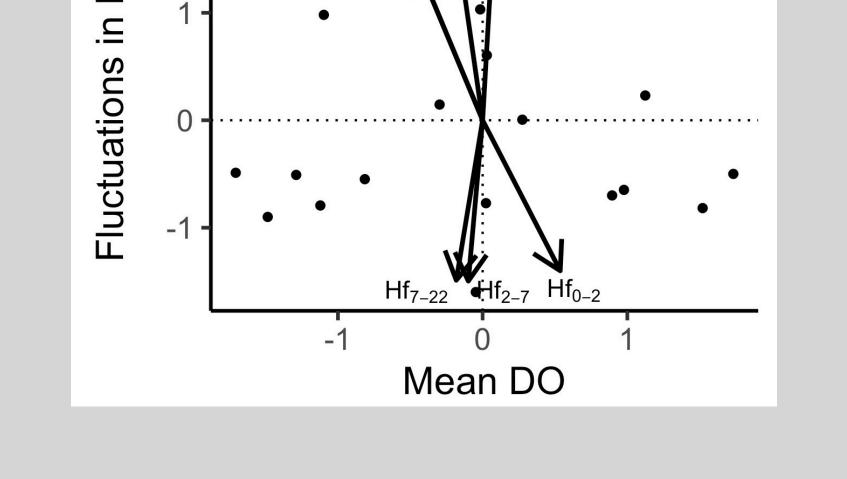


Figure 1: Collaboration network

Question: Can we measure ecosystem function?

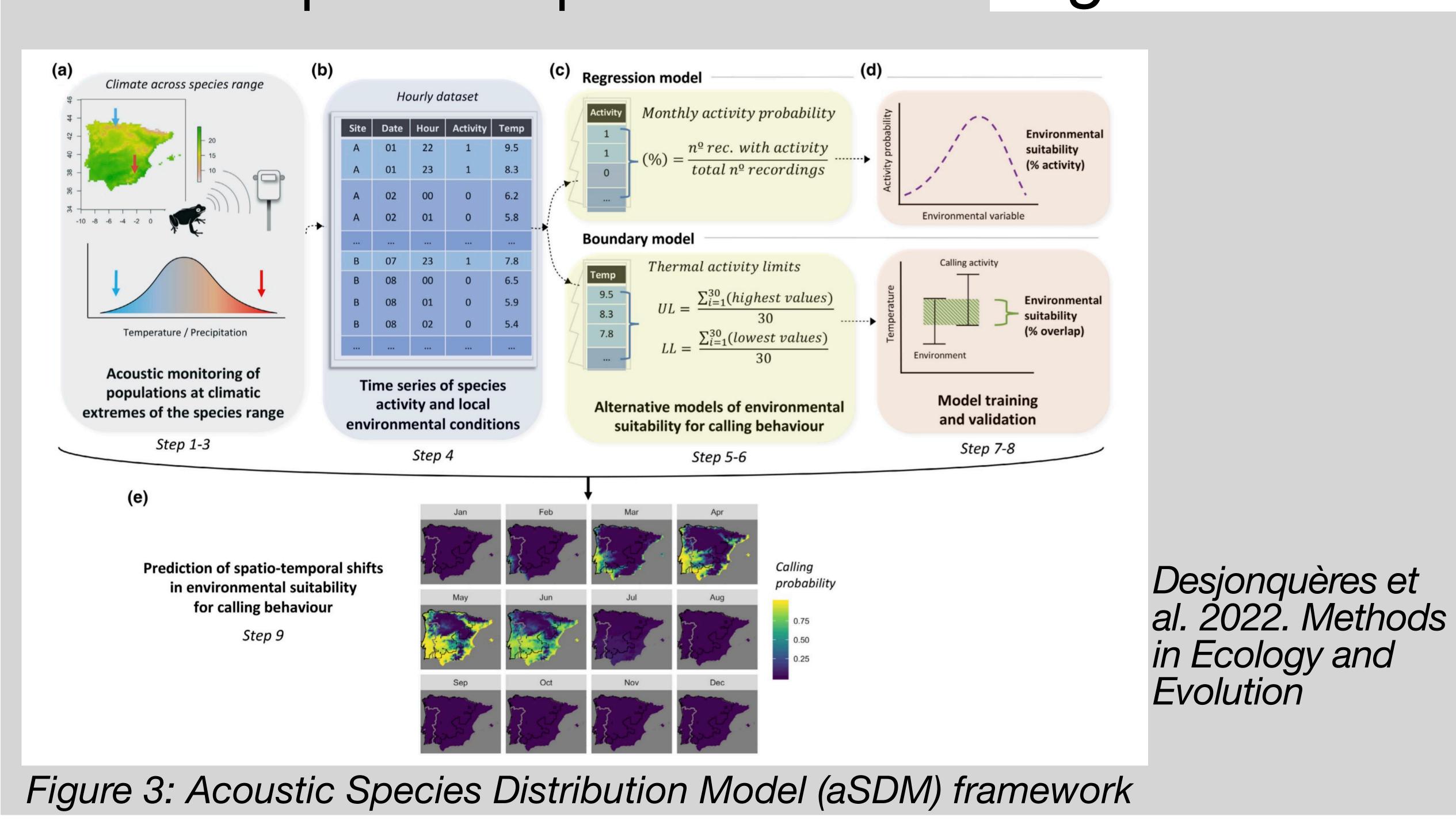




Results: Plants are noisy
