# Bacterial biomineralization is often considered as a non controlled mineralization process (except for MTB)



Modern stromatolite formed in Sardinia Debrie et al. (2022) Chem Geol e.g., extracellular  $CaCO_3$  precipitation by cyanobacteria

$$6Ca^{2+} + 12HCO_3^{-} \longrightarrow 6CaCO_3 + C_6H_{12}O_6 + 6O_2$$

#### Unusual element fractionation by, e.g., *Gloeomargarita lithophora* = preferential uptake of high-Z alkaline earth metals

 $\rightarrow$  Formation of Sr and/or Ba-rich ACC despite inconsistent environmental chemical conditions

= singularity of intracellular carbonates

# Some of these bacteria may help remediate radioactive pollutions (<sup>90</sup>Sr and <sup>226</sup>Ra)

 $\rightarrow$  efficient trapping of heavy alkaline earth metals, incl. radioactive isotopes

 $\Rightarrow$  New family of genes (*ccyA*)/proteins (calcyanin)

#### What is CoBaHMA ?



Blue: basic; red: acidic; cyan: histidine

CoBaHMA found in 2227 different bacterial proteins

>74 different types of protein modular organizations

#### Membrane proteins involved in transport or lipid metabolism

## Genomic neighboring of ccyA

 $\rightarrow$  ccyA in a megaplasmid in Fischerella sp NIES-4106.



 $\rightarrow$  ccyA in the genome of Microcystis aeruginosa PCC 7806



Some neighboring genes particularly interesting :

 $\star$  Ca<sup>2+</sup>/H<sup>+</sup> exchanger (cax)

\* Domain of unknown function (DUF) encodes a CoBaHMA domain (no CoBaHMA in Microcystis calcyanin)



Expression of neighboring genes is correlated with that of ccyA: transcription unit?

Genetics: Expression of ccyA in a cyanobacterium not forming ACC

Synechococcus elongatus PCC 7942, wild type and mutants expressing ccyA

Mutants expressing ccyA have higher Ca contents They do not form ACC

Need more than one gene to form intracellular ACC

## Are cyanobacteria the only ACC-forming bacteria? NO

### The biomineralization of iACC in one gammaproteobacterium may be related to Cyanobacteria = Methylococcus geothermalis

## ACC-forming MTB are abundant in Lake Pavin







Ongoing development of a method to detect all of them efficiently, count them and assess their diversity

## Why have they been overlooked before?



Before cell fixation (glutaraldehyde)

> After cell fixation

After dehydration

 $\rightarrow$  ACC are lost upon classical sample preparation techniques  $\rightarrow$  Different response to magnetic field for ACC-forming MTB (Monteil et al. 2020)

#### Link between biomineralization and primary metabolisms?

Oxygenic photosynthesis

6  $Ca^{2+}$  + 12  $HCO_3^{-}$  = 6  $CaCO_3$  +  $C_6H_{12}O_6$  + 6 $O_2$ 

Sulfoxidation

 $2H_2S + O_2 + Ca^{2+} + HCO_3^{-} = 2S(0) + 2H_2O + CaCO_3$ 

Aerobic methane oxidation/methylotrophy/carboxydotrophy  $CH_4 + O_2 + CaCO_3 = Ca^{2+} + 2HCO_3^{-1}$  $CO + 2H_2O + CaCO_3 = Ca^{2+} + H_2 + 2HCO_3^{-1}$ 

Some should favor ACC precipitation; other should favor dissolution

All seem to be able to fix  $CO_2$ 

## Shared origin among all bacteria?

 $\rightarrow$  No certainty as long as we do not know how exactly bacteria form ACC

 $\rightarrow$  If primary metabolism is part of the process, then it works differently for the different ACC-forming bacteria

 $\rightarrow$  If ccyA is involved in cyanobacterial biomineralization, it is not found in MTB (unless we missed a remote homolog) but found in Methylococcus

 $\rightarrow$  Lipid-bilayer compartment in MTB and Achromatium/ proteins in Cyanobacteriota

 $\rightarrow$  Ca transport: vacualar-type pumps in Achromatium and MTB (?) vs Ca<sup>2+</sup>/H<sup>+</sup> exchanger in cyanobacteria + other proteins

## (Causal role) Function(s)?

Cosmidis and Benzerara (2022) Comptes rendus Géoscience

- $\rightarrow$  intracellular pH buffer/source of H<sup>+</sup>
- $\rightarrow$  Reservoir of inorganic C
- $\rightarrow$  Reservoir of Ca

 $\rightarrow$  Ballast

 $Ca^{2+} + HCO_{3}^{-} = CaCO_{3} + H^{+}$ 

ACC very reactive

ACC density =  $2.18 \text{ g/cm}^3$  (?)

Which parameter increased fitness so that this trait was eventually selected during evolution?

#### Conclusions

- Broad diversity of bacteria able to biomineralize intracellular amorphous carbonates
- This diversity is still most likely underestimated, including within MTB
- This may have some environmental impact
- Controlled mineralization but molecular mechanisms and function remain largely unknown
- It most likely involves more than one gene. Some of these genes encode proteins/domains annotated as hypothetical or of unknown function
- Evolutionary history?
