

R Implementation of a Transgenerational Hologenomic Model-based Simulator (RITHMS) is a framework for simulating **transgenerational hologenomic data** that relies on **MoBPS** features for genomic data, accounts for the particularities of microbiota transmission, uses **real genomic and microbiota data** to construct a base population, and is flexible enough to cover a variety of scenarios defined by heritability, microbiability, and microbiota heritability.



Summary

In this work, we introduced a novel algorithm for simulating **transgenerational hologenomic data**, implemented in the R package RITHMS. Our tool **expands the scope** of existing simulation methods for multigenerational genotypes (**MoBPS** [1], **AlphaSimR** [2]) or for a single generation of microbiota under genetic influence (**Simubiome** [3]). RITHMS directly accounts for the **structure and characteristics of the microbiota** as well as its complex link with **host genotype transmission via the maternal or ambient environment**, and the impact of **isolated or sustained environmental effects**. We illustrated the use of RITHMS to simulate **complex selection and breeding programs**, both for the performance of various selection strategies incorporating the genome, microbiota, or hologenome as well as for the **construction of a customized integrated selection index**.
