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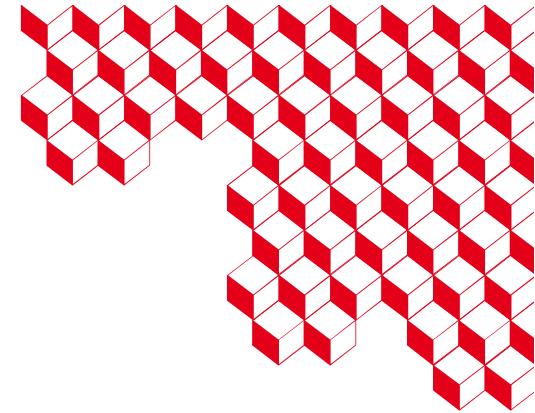

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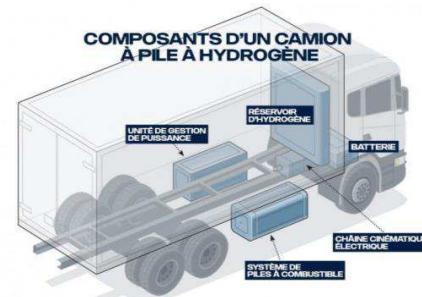


# HYSYSPEM project : Simplify PEMFC systems

The European Union has set a target of reducing emissions from heavy duty vehicles by **45%** by **2030**.

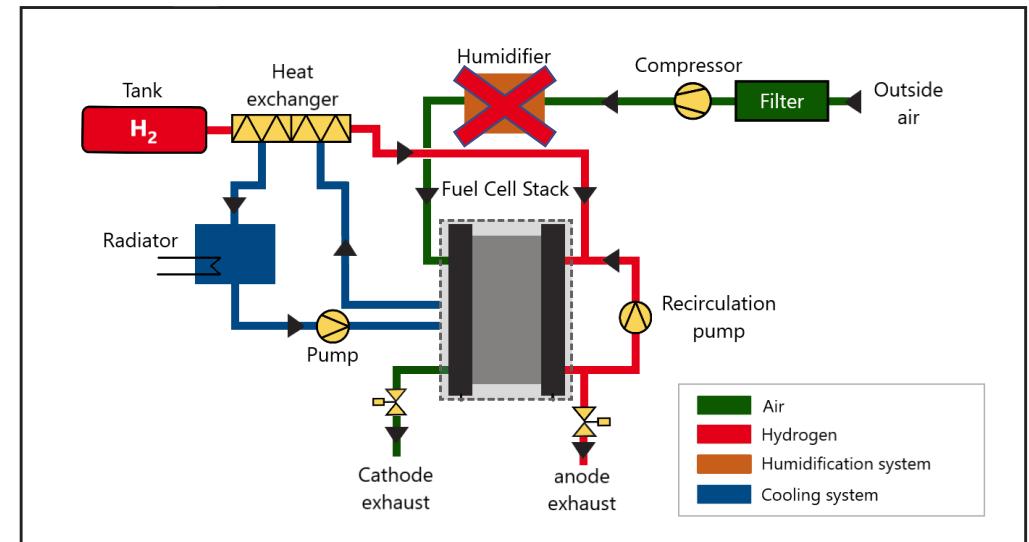
The **HYSYSPEM** project involves the design of a hybrid fuel cell system:

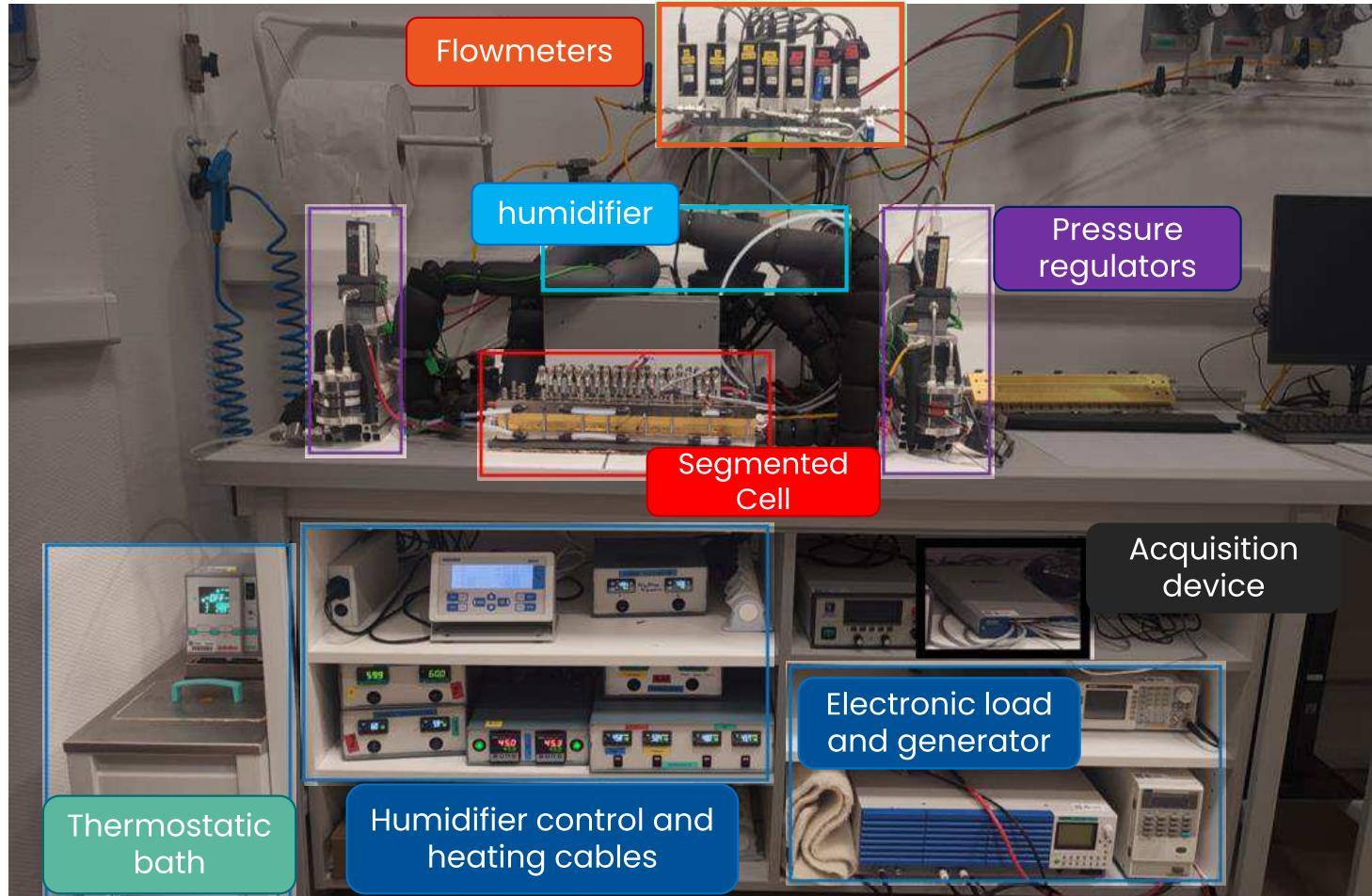

# Influence of air stoichiometry



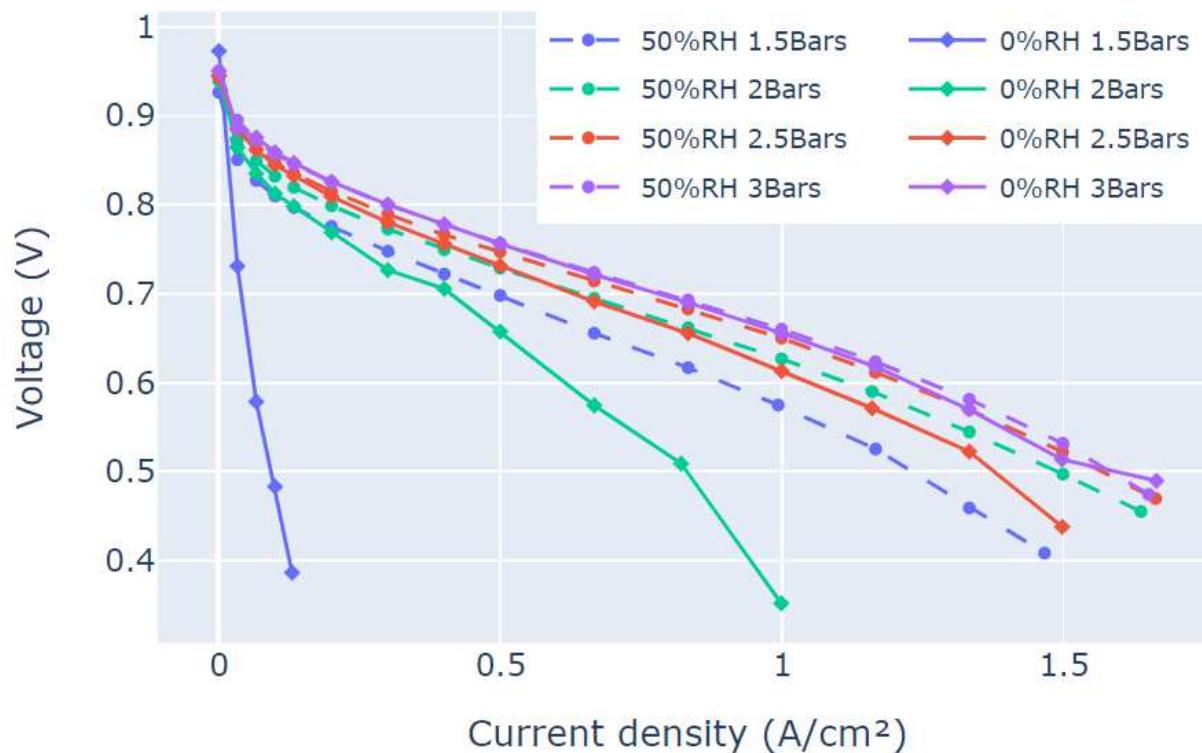
- **Performance increases** with air stoichiometry for the humid case
  - **Performance strongly decreases** with air stoichiometry for the dry case
- Increased flow of dry air **dries out the membrane**

# Influence of pressure



- Performance **increases** with pressure
  - Increased pressure **reduces the difference** between the dry and wet cases
- Relative humidity **increase** with pressure

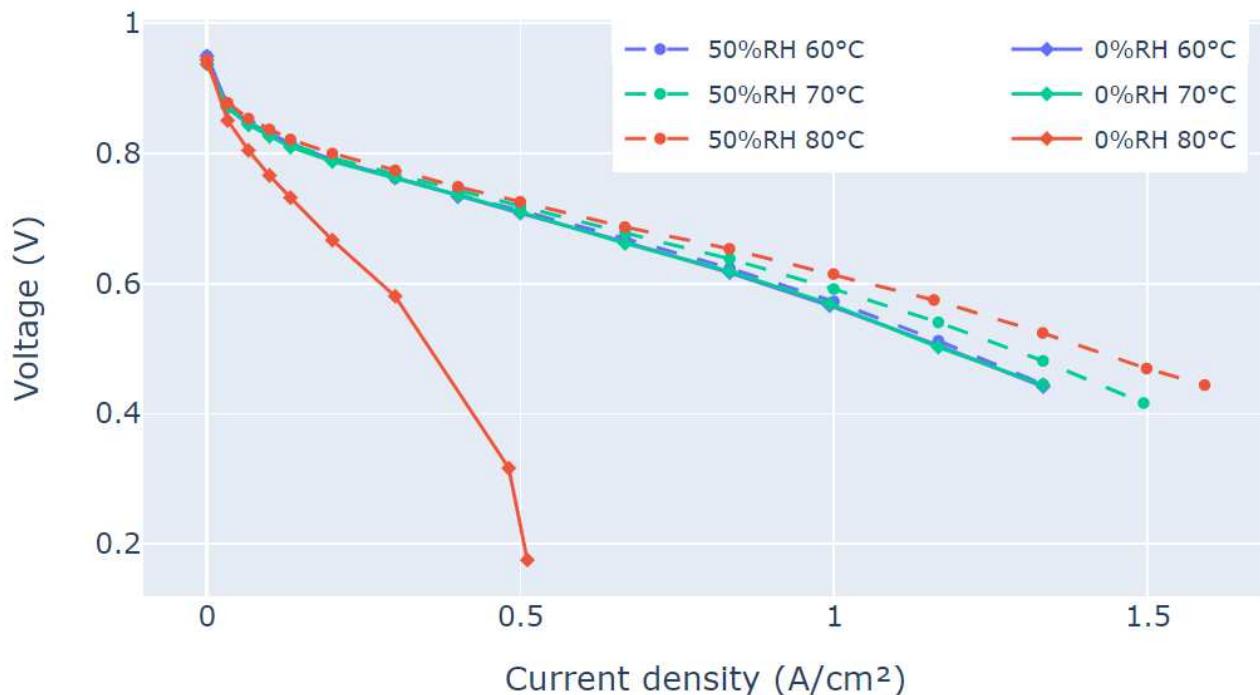

# Influence of temperature



- Performance **decreases** with temperature for dry case
  - Decrease temperature **reduces the difference** between the dry and wet cases
- Relative humidity **decrease** with temperature

$$RH = \frac{x_{H_2O} \times P_{tot}}{P_{sat}(T)}$$

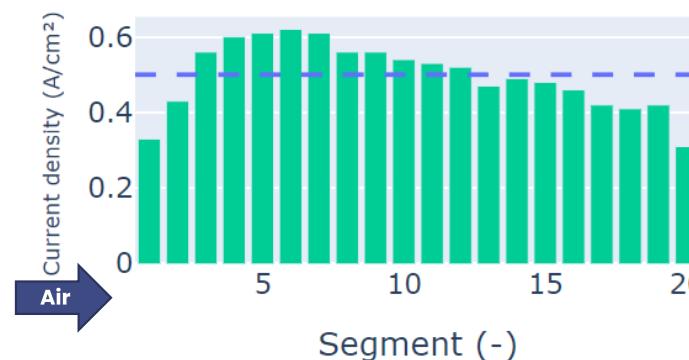

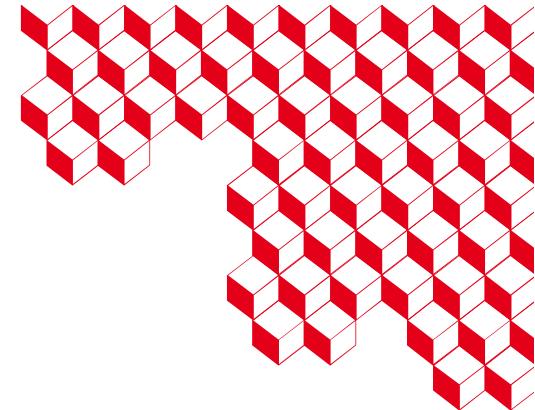


# Conclusions & perspectives

Experiments have shown that it is possible to ensure **stable and high-performance** operation of the cell when it is supplied **with dry air**

→ **Operating parameters** need to be adjusted :

- **High pressure** helps to saturate the gases with moisture from the water produced inside the cell.
  - **Low air stoichiometry** facilitates dry operation by reducing membrane drying.
  - **Increase hydrogen stoichiometry and relative humidity** improves the hydration of the membrane by the anode, which favors operation with dry air.
  - **Low temperature** helps to saturate the gases with moisture from the water produced inside the cell.
- Ageing tests will allow to determine whether operating with a dry air supply has an **impact on the durability** of the cell.
- Tests with **another MEA** and **modelling** work will complete the study.
