# Context

**New European legislation on electric car batteries' durability:** State of health > 72% over 8y/160 000km<sup>[1]</sup> (*implementation in 2030*)

Investigation of degradation mechanisms such as Li plating

### Li plating mechanism:

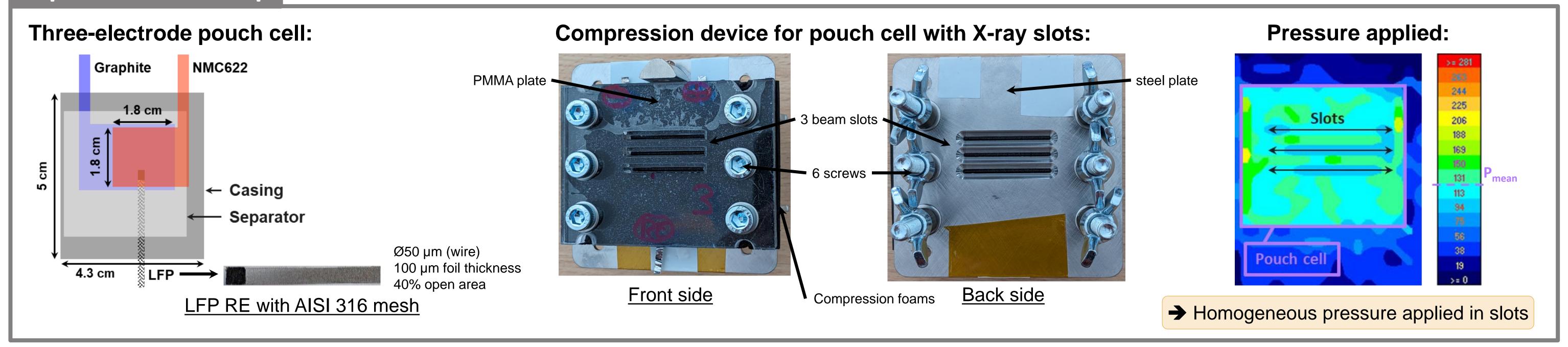
Irreversibly consumes Li+, reducing batterie state of health

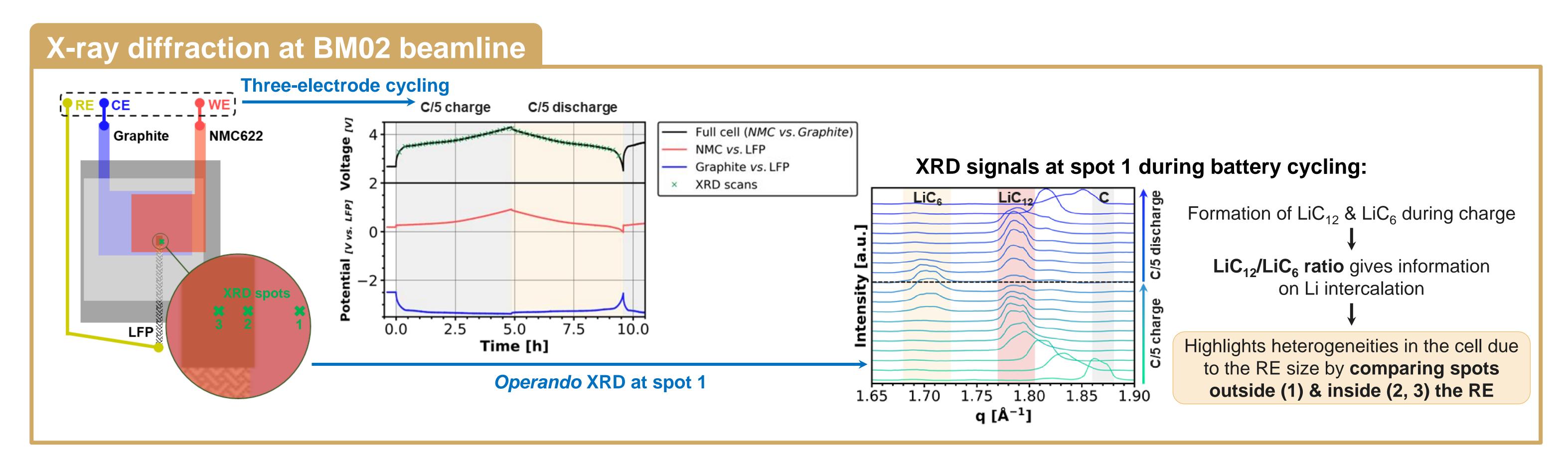
Triggered locally when  $E_{Graphite} < 0 V vs. Li^+/Li^{[2]}$ 

#### The RE locally hinders the Li<sup>+</sup> flow: Li [mol/m<sup>3</sup>]<sub>×104</sub> <sup>-</sup> diffusion in the electrolyte • Excess of Li near the edge of the RE RE (Ø200 µm wire) cathode-Normal • **Deficit of Li** under the RE SOC30 anode Inhomogeneous lithiation cathode Normal Different behaviors SOC97 anode probed by the RE Li distribution in electrodes near and far from the RE (modeling)<sup>[adapted from 3]</sup>

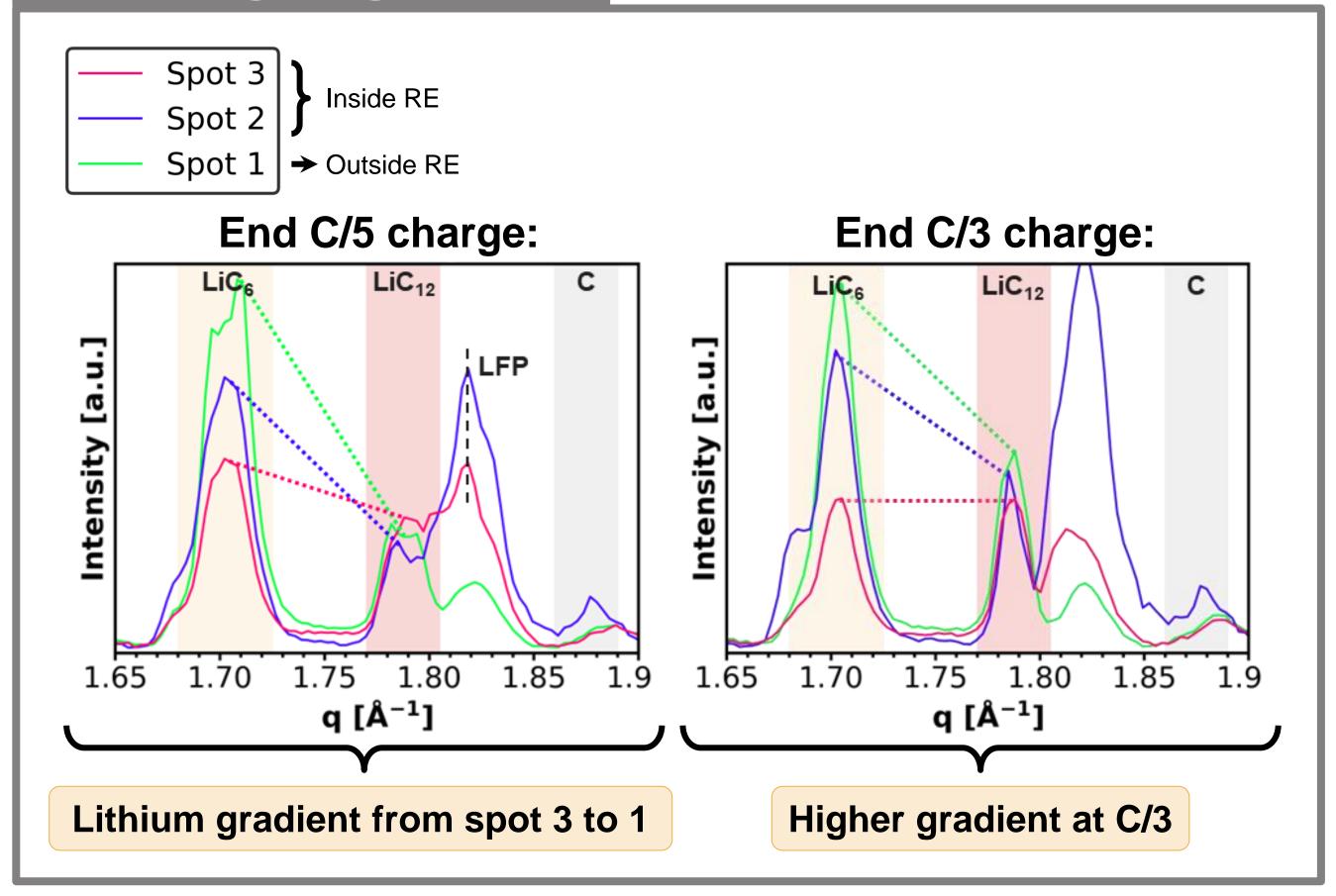
**Objective:** Quantify the impact of a RE with mesh geometry

 $\Box$  Fit of LiC<sub>12</sub> & LiC<sub>6</sub> peaks for quantitative results

□ Additionnal data at 1C, 2C and 3C to be investigated

 $\Box$  Correlation between LiC<sub>12</sub>/LiC<sub>6</sub> ratio and RE measurement to study its accuracy

Investigation of LFP peaks to follow the evolution of the RE chemical composition
