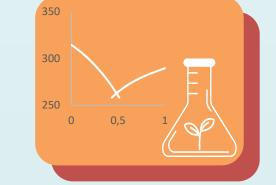

Introduction

Arthrospira platensis Microalgae like Spirulina are a valuable source of biomolecules, including fatty acids (FFA) free presenting antiinflammatory, moisturizing and regulating properties, highly valued in the cosmetic industry.<sup>1</sup>



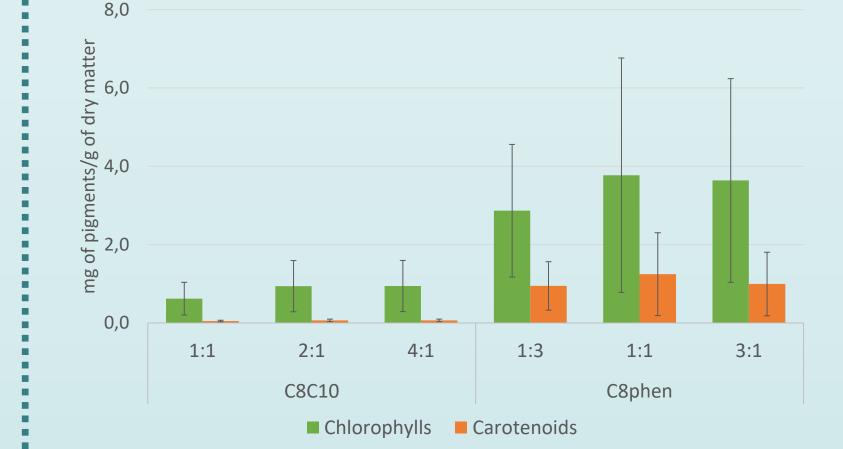
Natural Eutectic Deep Solvents (NaDES) as green alternatives Spirulina for **extraction:** bio-based solvents made from two or more compounds found in plant primary metabolites.<sup>2</sup>

- **Easy to prepare**
- Nonvolatile
- Biodegradable



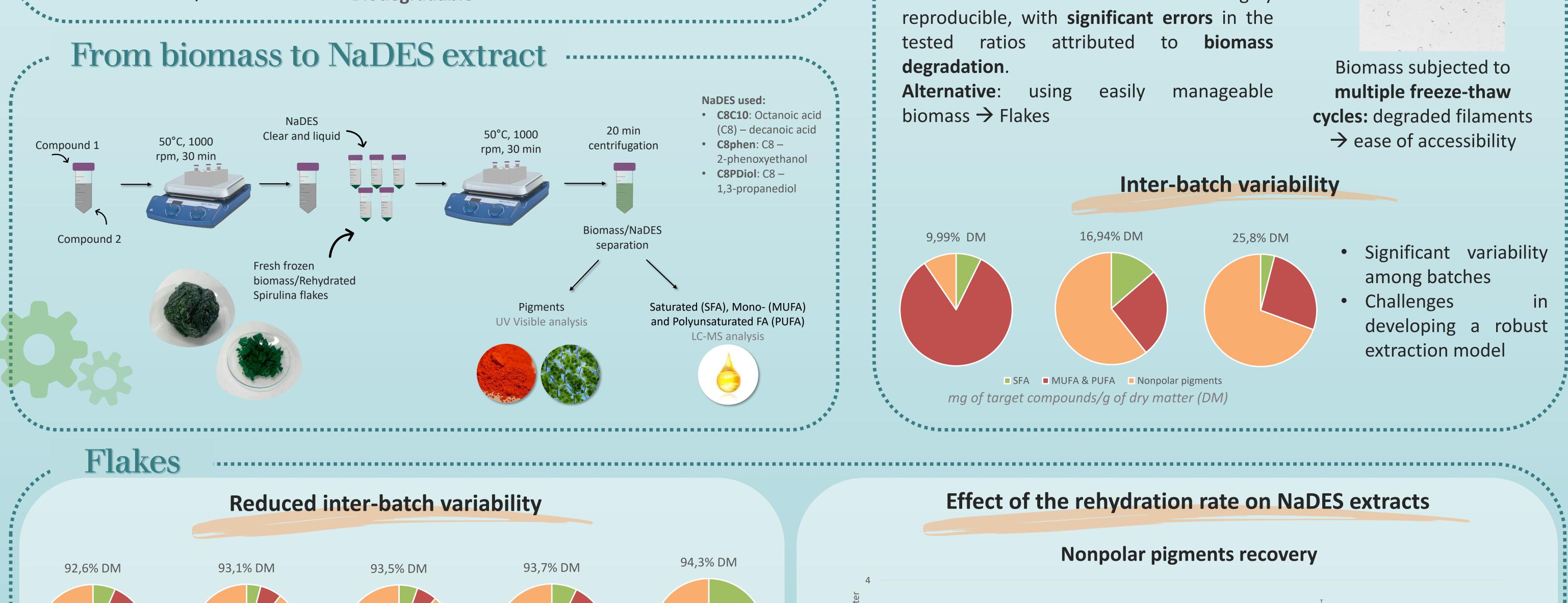
Spirulina, a waterrich biomass Water impact? parameters What can optimize and facilitate extraction potential for а scaling up?





**Fresh biomass** 

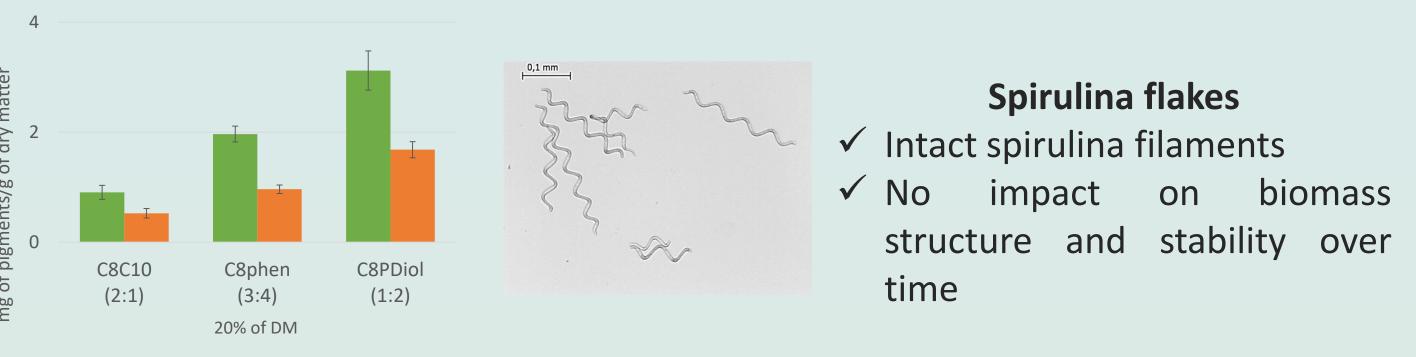
The initial analyses of the fresh biomass revealed results that were not highly **Freshly thawed biomass** Intact spirulina filaments  $\rightarrow$  limited accessibility



mg of target compounds/g of dry matter (DM) MUFA & PUFA Nonpolar pigments SFA

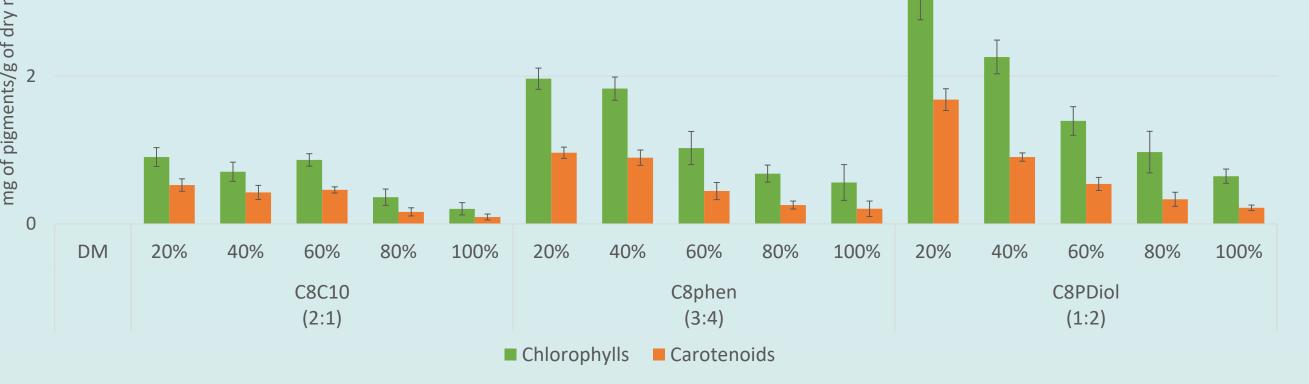
- Reduced inter-batch variability for flakes, in contrast with fresh biomass
- Ease of biomass handling and possibility to establish an extraction model for potential scaling up

**Reproducibility of data with rehydrated flakes** 



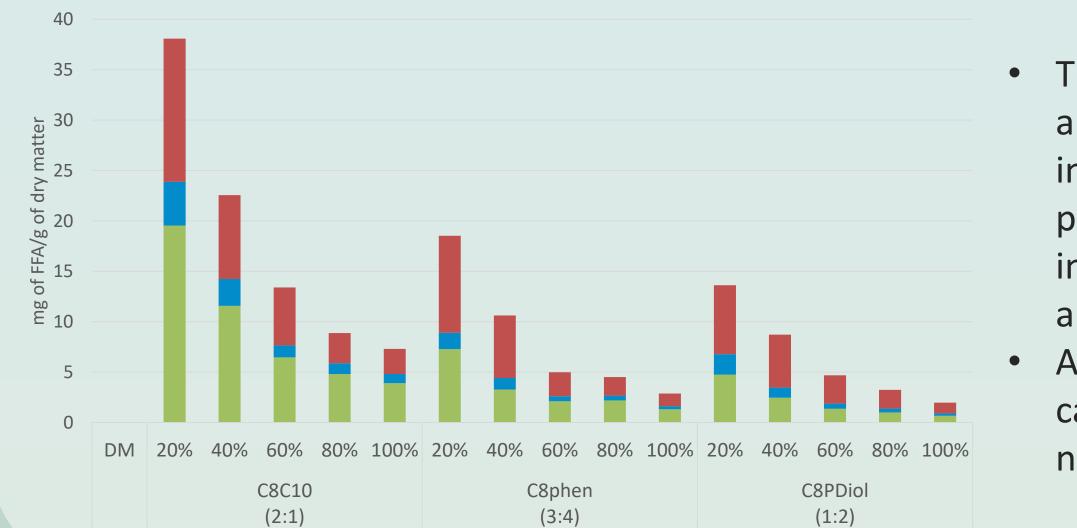
### Chlorophylls Carotenoids

- Despite reduced extractability compared to fresh biomass, flakes have been identified as a more practical option due to the reproducibility of results and their stability over time.
- Does the water content of the medium influence the final extract?



The water impact was studied from 20% to 100% DM content:

- A negative correlation was found between the degree of biomass hydration and pigment levels for C8phen and C8PDiol (NaDES with intermediate polarity)
- C8C10 exhibited a plateau between 20% and 60% DM content.



## Free Fatty Acids (FFA) recovery

- The rehydration rate appears to generally induce a decrease in pigment and FA levels, including SFA, MUFA and PUFA.
- Accordingly, the rate can be adjusted as needed.

## **Conclusions and perspectives**

## **Fresh frozen Spirulina biomass**

- Good extraction capability
- Poor shelf life leading to divergent results
- Variable inter-batch composition

- **Spirulina flakes**
- Good shelf life
- Long-term stability
- Lower extraction capacity
- but easier extraction and potential scalability
- A rehydrated biomass generally exhibits higher extractability compared to a dry biomass
- Water in the medium appears to enhance extractive capacity

## Perspectives

- Study water behavior with NaDES
- Implement in other extraction processes
- Scale up under optimal conditions
